CROP Hunger Walk-October 16th

We will gather with other faith communities of Boulder County to fight hunger both here and around the world. 75% of the money raised goes to Church World Service to feed people around the world, and 24% stays here in Boulder/Broomfield Counties to help Community Food Share, and 1% goes to Bread for the World. The walk this year will start at Atonement Lutheran Church on Baseline in Boulder. You can choose to walk the long route (approximately 6 miles) or the shorter walk, (approximately 2 miles). You can participate by walking on the 16th or contributing to (sponsoring) someone who is walking. Pete Terpenning is the lead organizer this year for CUCC. Pete will be available between services and after the 10:30 service to answer questions and sign people up. You can also go online to Crophungerwalk.org and sign up for our team: Community United Church of Christ, Boulder. Last year we had 14 walkers and raised \$6,163.63. Our goal this year is \$7,000.
